DA-PRDP lands second consecutive satisfactory rating during the 13th World Bank ISM

The Department of Philippine Rural Agriculture – Development Project (DA-PRDP) scored another milestone, as the Project received an overall Satisfactory rating for its project development objectives, second straight rating for the year, during the recently concluded 13th World Bank Implementation Support Mission (WB ISM) to the DA-PRDP.

During the Wrap-Up Meeting held on December 16, 2021, World Bank Task Team Leader Eli Weiss presented the 13th WB ISM Aide Memoire, which included the overall Satisfactory rating, covering Development Objectives, Overall Implementation Progress, Project Management, Procurement, Financial Management, Monitoring, Evaluation and Management Information System (MIS), and

Global Environment Objectives (GEO).

Weiss, together with World Bank Operations Manager Achim Fock, lauded the DA-PRDP for continuing to set the bar at a high level in project implementation.

Held virtually for the fourth time, the WB ISM is a three-week event of consultations, discussions, virtual site visits, workshops, and action planning from the DA-PRDP's National Project Coordination Office (NPCO), Project Support Offices (PSOs), and Regional Project

Coordination Offices (RPCOs).

In his message delivered during the Kick-Off Meeting on November 29, 2021, Secretary Dar reminded the DA-PRDP to keep in mind the overall effects of the Mission on the agriculture and fisheries sector.



The DA-PRDP then proceeded on presenting its updates to the World Bank and the European Union, through its I-PLAN, I-BUILD, I-REAP, and I-SUPPORT Components.

I-PLAN Under the Component, a total of 135 Value Chain Analysis have been approved, commodities supporting 77 and product forms. For rural infrastructure development, the I-BUILD Component has completed 1,400 kilometers of roads, 1,121 meters of bridges, 2,278 hectares of area provided with improved irrigation or drainage services, household beneficiaries from potable water systems, and 104 pre and post harvest facilities. For enterprise development, the I-REAP Component has a total of 495 completed subprojects, assisting 648 Proponent Groups that equals to 100,888 household beneficiaries.

Usec Cayanan, during his welcome message, expressed his gratitude to the NPCO, PSOs, and RPCOs, encouraging the Project to perform efficiently and effectively.

"I commend the outstanding efforts done by the PRDP, from the NPCO, PSOs, and RPCOs, but we are not yet done. Let us continue to perform our duties as public servants, ready to help communities with the brand of good governance the PRDP is known for," Usec. Cayanan said.

With the approval of the Second Additional Financing with the E.U. co-financing grant in place, the European Union is now set to join in the next phase of the DA-PRDP and succeeding Missions.

The next 14th World Bank Implementation Support Mission to the DA-PRDP is tentatively scheduled on May 23, 2022. The ISM is conducted twice a year to assess and give updates on the implementation of subprojects in the four (4) clusters - North Luzon, South Luzon, Visayas and Mindanao. (Iconn Mel D.
